


Like progress toward the Eagle Scouting award, the AION Path combines a series of valuable challenges and assignments completed over three years.

3 years of engagement for a lifetime of fulfillment. Starting age: 13. Completing age: 16.\*



#### Year One Look:

## The First 90 Days, Engage

30 skills

Select team

Church Engage

→ Adventure

CELEBRATE MILESTONE

Identify the 30 skills your child wants to develop: life, relational, recreational, or vocational skills.

Identify shepherd and choose three guides you would like to speak into your child's life on spiritual, financial, and other relevant life matters. Prioritize church to help your child discover the value of worship, God's Word, community and gain deeper understanding of the congregation. Collaborate with your child on what overnight adventures you would go on. Pick several options to have some for the future.
